

Prof. Zvika Brakerski is a faculty member in the department of computer science and applied mathematics at the Weizmann Institute of Science, Israel. He received his Ph.D. in 2011 from the Weizmann Institute of Science, and then spent two years as a postdoctoral scholar at Stanford University. He then rejoined the Weizmann institute as a faculty member in 2013. His work is focused on theoretical cryptography. Some areas to which he made contributions include: the design of fully homomorphic encryption schemes (FHE), other forms of advanced cryptographic primitives such as program obfuscation, the foundations and applications of lattice-based cryptography, and quantum aspects of cryptography. His awards and honors include the Alon Memorial Fellowship (2014), the Prof. Pazy Memorial Research Award (2015), the Wolf Foundation Krill Prize (2017), the IEEE FOCS Test of Time award (2022), ACM SIGACT / EATCS Gödel Prize for Outstanding Papers (2022), and the Blavatnik Israel Award for Young Scientists (2023).
