

Schraga Schwartz is a professor at the Weizmann Institute, where his group focuses on elucidating functions of RNA modifications and harnessing these towards RNA therapeutics. He earned his PhD at Tel Aviv University with a primary focus on RNA splicing and performed his post-doc at the Broad Institute under the guidance of professors Aviv Regev and Eric Lander, where his research focused on RNA modifications. In recognition of his work, Schraga earned numerous grants and awards including European Research Council (ERC) starting and consolidator grants, the RNA Society Early Career Research award, the Wolf Foundation Krill Prize for excellence in Scientific Research and the Blavatnik award for young scientists.
