

Roni Porat is a Senior Lecturer at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem in the Departments of Political Science and International Relations. She completed her Ph.D. at the Hebrew University of Jerusalem in Israel, and her post doctoral training at Princeton University. Her research examines micro- and meso-level forces that shape intergroup relations. She studies institutional processes and psychological mechanisms that reduce prejudice and violence, increase equality, and redistribute power across groups. Her work combines experimental and quasi-experimental methods in both laboratory and field settings.

Upon joining the Hebrew University, Roni was awarded an Azrieli Early Career Faculty Fellowship, presented to just eight new faculty members across Israel each year. She was recently awarded the Gugenheim Foundation Distinguished Scholars 2024 award, and is a Global Scholar Fellow at CIFAR. She was also awarded the APS Rising Star Award – The Association for Psychological Science's recognition for outstanding researchers in the earliest stages of their postdoctoral career whose innovative work has already advanced the field. Roni is the mother of Ann, Bar, and Uma, the partner of Avishai.
